Blanket making party – Host a blanket making party at your office and let your employees bond over making blankets for patients at Children's Colorado. *Fees apply to cover the costs of the supplies.*

Cuddle Buddies – Build “cuddle buddies” (*similar to Build-A-Bear*) for the patients at Children's Colorado. They come in all shapes and sizes - bears, unicorns, penguins, frogs and more. You can even make a fun competition out of it for a team building event! *Fees apply to cover the costs of the supplies.*

Customized craft party (Anschutz) – Various companies host craft parties in the main atrium of Children's Colorado, where patients and families can create their own craft! These allow up to 12 volunteers and can be set up quarterly.

Family Resource Center (Anschutz) – Small groups (up to 7 volunteers) can serve breakfast to our parents and families M-F at 8:30am in the Family Resource Center. Companies can also provide resources such as board games, movies, toiletry kits, books, magazines, pre-packaged foods, etc.

Volunteer in the community – We attend events throughout the Denver Metro area and are always in need of volunteers to help staff our booths and hand out educational materials along with fun giveaways! *Examples: The National Western Stock Show (January), Cheyenne Frontier Days (July), Pumpkin Festival at Botanical Gardens (October) and many more!*

Adopt a Family – Groups can “Adopt a Family” from Children's Colorado that are in need over the holiday season and provide them with important items. The generosity of this gift is felt where it counts the most, in the heart of a child.

Snow Pile (Anschutz) – Patient families select gifts for their loved ones. We need volunteers to staff toy tables and help the families shop for the perfect gift.
